ctober marked the **second anniversary of the launch of Champagnat Global.** We have to acknowledge with humility and gratitude that this model, which we have been devising together and which we are gradually adapting to our needs, continues to grow satisfactorily. Our school community is gradually becoming aware that walking together benefits us all, and in this sense a culture of integration is being generated, which is reflected in the number of people registered on our Agorá platform, which has tripled in just a few months.

This second year of the network's evolution has been marked by important milestones, including the face-toface meeting in Mexico of the education coordinators of the different administrative units, the planning of the Champagnat Global roadmap for the period 2023-25 and the different open activities involving the whole school community, such as the Champagnat celebration with the International Webinar: Building the Global Education Pact at Marist School, the Champagnat Global Week and the launch of the formation area, with the launch of the MOOC on Global Citizenship.

On **Monday 16th** a course on Global Citizenship was launched for a pioneering group that will be trained in the knowledge of how to live and promote the experience of global citizenship among our students. This course will be open, in a few months, to the entire Marist educational community.

On Wednesday 18th we were able to enjoy a wonderful conference given by an expert in educational innovation: Xavier Aragay, from whom we were able to learn about the keys to tackling the transformation required by today's schools. On **Thursday 19th** we lived a very enriching webinar learning from the experiences of many of our companions who in different parts of the world are creatively developing **spirituality in the daily practice of teaching in Marist schools. On **Friday 20th** we got together a group interested in promoting the knowledge of Marist Schools through the development of a sporting activity and we launched the <u>Champagnat Global Run</u>. #### START OF THE GLOBAL CITIZENSHIP COURSE

On 16 October 2023, in the framework of the Champagnat Global Week, the MOOC (Massive Open Online Course) on Global Citizenship was launched.

The course is an introduction to the theme of global citizenship and aims to help teachers and those responsible for Marist formation to further Marcellin Champagnat's purpose: "To form good Christians and virtuous citizens", in today's world which increasingly values respect and diversity, a commitment to social justice and the achievement of a more equitable and sustainable world.



The course consists of 6 modules:

Global citizens.

Bridge builders in a fragmented world.

Our Common Home / Integral Ecology.

Messengers of Peace.

Children's rights / Agents of change.

Global spirituality.

MOOCs, as their name suggests, are massive open courses, in this case for all those interested in learning and interacting about what it means to form global citizens in our educational reality. However, in its first edition it has been limited to a pioneering group of 150 members of the Marist educational community (directors, teachers and collaborators of Marist schools), selected by the coordination of mission and education of each of the administrative units of the Marist Institute, in order to validate the proposal for its mass launch.

The learning methodology is flexible, with 24-hour access to the platform, each student following his or her own pace.

Those who complete the course itinerary will receive a certification from the **Marist University PUCRS** (Brazil).

#### THE CHAMPAGNAT GLOBAL RUN IS ALREADY UNDERWAY

Sport and global networking go hand in hand in this project, presented last Global Week, which aims to establish contacts between Marist schools around the world.



The first to start was <u>Chamberí</u> (Madrid), which decided to begin with a nearby target: the <u>San José del Parque</u> <u>school</u>. What they did not know at the time was that they would be the second school in Spain to launch this initiative: <u>La Merced - Fuensanta</u> (Murcia). Once both schools established contact they decided to go together to their next destination: <u>N<sup>a</sup> S<sup>a</sup> de la Victoria</u> - Málaga.

<u>Maristes Anna Ravell</u> (Barcelona) was the third Spanish school to set off on a kilometre walk. The 3rd year ESO students were divided into three groups and each of them decided on a destination: <u>Christopher Columbus High</u>, <u>Colégio Marista Sao José</u> and <u>Istituto Fratelli Maristi</u>.

On the other side of the Atlantic, they've also laced up their trainers and are already covering kilometres, in this case, between countries.

On the one hand, the <u>Hidalgo school in Cocula</u> (Mexico) has a clear objective: <u>Christopher Columbus</u> (Miami - **United States**) and this is reflected in the <u>launch video of</u> their first target school. Santiago González, director of Hidalgo de Cocula, has already decided on his next destination and although it is still a secret, we can say that from this great little secondary school they are going to cross the pond with one objective: to raise awareness of the importance of learning languages among their pupils.

These four schools have already started to run kilometres, but two others are already organising the Global Run kick-off. This is the case of <u>Instituto</u> <u>Queretano San Javier</u> (Mexico) and <u>ICFP Diocese</u> <u>Baucau</u> (Timor).

At the meeting, participants discussed the importance of the formation of global citizens in the Marist school and how this should be part of the ethos of the school. They also talked about the importance of being an active part of the global network of Marist schools, Champagne Global, and how collaboration and creativity are fundamental to its success.



The need to work together in a world of uncertainty and constant innovation was discussed and how the network can help address these challenges.



AFRICA AND CHAMPAGNAT GLOBAL MISSION COMMISSION MEETING



The experience of the first face-to-face meeting of Champagnat Gloal in Mexico 2022 was very enriching in terms of planning the future of the network of schools, but above all it generated bonds and a commitment to the project that is difficult to achieve without personal interaction. For various reasons, none of the members of the mission commission from the African region were able to participate in this meeting. The Nairobi meeting of the commission on 20-24 November 2023 was a good opportunity to replicate the same spirit experienced in Mexico.

The assembly of the Africa Mission Commission is made up of Brothers Michel Mami (Madagascar), Isaac Kwame (West Africa), Michel Longena (Central East Africa), Paul Angulu (Nigeria) and Francis Jumbe (Southern Africa), with the presence of the Secretariat of Education and Evangelisation represented by Brother José Sánchez Bravo.

In the space dedicated to Champagnat Global, within the programmed agenda, an opportunity was taken to take a



look at the itinerary of the network, to analyse the strengths, the opportunities and the aspirations that this global space offers us and to get to know the different ways of getting involved in the opportunities that the platform offers us.

The meeting was also an opportunity to maintain personal contacts between each of the Mission coordinators and the executive secretariat of Champagnat Global and to make progress in the practical aspects of joining the network.

One of the most enriching aspects of this meeting was undoubtedly the conviviality, listening to each other, getting to know and understand the realities of each province and feeling united around a global project which, on the basis of personal closeness, greatly facilitates the development of the synergy necessary to promote shared strategies and initiatives.

From Champagnat Global, we are grateful for the willingness and commitment of the mission commission of Africa to walk together as a global family.

#### CHAMPAGNAT GLOBAL-MEXICO 2022. The Richness of Meeting Each other

From 28 November to 6 December 2022, the first faceto-face meeting of members of the Marist Global Schools Network: CHAMPAGNAT GLOBAL took place in Mexico City. But seen from a distance, one year later, we can say that the Mexico 2022 meeting was transcendental for the network because it mainly made it possible:
